Inspection Blitzes Autumn Campaign *Musculoskeletal Disorders*



Musculoskeletal disorders (MSDs) are still one of the most common causes of lost-time injuries in Ontario. MSDs are injuries and disorders of the muscles, tendons and nerves. They may develop as a result of ongoing exposure to such things as repetitive work, forceful

exertions such as heavy lifting and carrying, awkward postures and vibrating equipment that can affect the bones, joints, ligaments and other soft tissues.

MSDs can occur in any type of workplace. They account for 43 per cent of all lost-time injuries in Ontario. In 2008 report by the Ministry of Labour states that this amounted to more than 33,000 injured workers and a loss of more than 1.2 million working days.

Starting in September and running until the end of October, the Ministry of Labour will be taking a close look at MSDs during its autumn inspection campaign.

Ministry inspectors will be visiting workplaces in all of Ontario's industries, looking for potential hazards that could contribute to the onset of an MSD.

In Canada, approximately 35,000 cardiac arrest occur annually. The odds of survival for an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest are approximately five per cent. However, they are almost four times greater if someone performs CPR immediately, and when combined with early defibrillation, AEDs can increase sudden cardiac arrest survival rates to 50 per cent or more if delivered in the first few minutes. With each passing minute, the probability of survival declines by seven to ten per cent. Making defibrillators easily accessible has the potential to save thousands of lives.
